
Instructions and Guidelines for Applicants of IMSA Fellow 2023 & 2024

- Researchers/Teachers/Faculty members aspiring for Fellow of IMSA should have a doctorate degree in Livestock Products Technology/Meat Science/ Animal Products Technology with a minimum of 15 years of professional experience in teaching, research and/ orextension. However, the applications of researchers/teachers in related disciplines from Scientific Institutions/organizations could be considered on the basis of outstanding contributions and experience in the field of meat science.
- 2. Applicant should be actively working in research/teaching/extension areas in any of the Universities/Research organization.
- 3. Applicant must be a life member of IMSA for a minimum of 5 years at the time of application.
- Duly completed application (soft copy) should be sent to the Secretary, IMSA, at imsanrcm@gmail.com so as to reach not later than 31st July 2024.
- 5. Before sending the nominations, please ensure that the form is to be signed by both the Proposer and the Seconder (A proposer can nominate not more than two persons and the seconder not more than three persons in a year).
- 6. Scientific achievements in different categories need to be provided in the separate sub-heads provided in the proforma.
- 7. Proof for claims made in different columns should be attached. No score will be given for any claims without proper proof.
- The application should be accompanied by a Bank Demand Draft in favour Indian Meat Science Association, Payable at Hyderabad for a sum of Rs. 500/- for Indian (USD 50/- for foreign nationals) towards processing fee.
- 9. Application which is not in the prescribed format or which gives incomplete or incorrect information is liable for outright rejection.

10. A minimum score of 60 out of 100 must be obtained for consideration of IMSA Fellow.

11. An admission fee-cum-life time subscription of Rs. 10,000/- (USD 500/- for applicants abroad) is payable by an applicant upon his/her selection for IMSA fellow.
